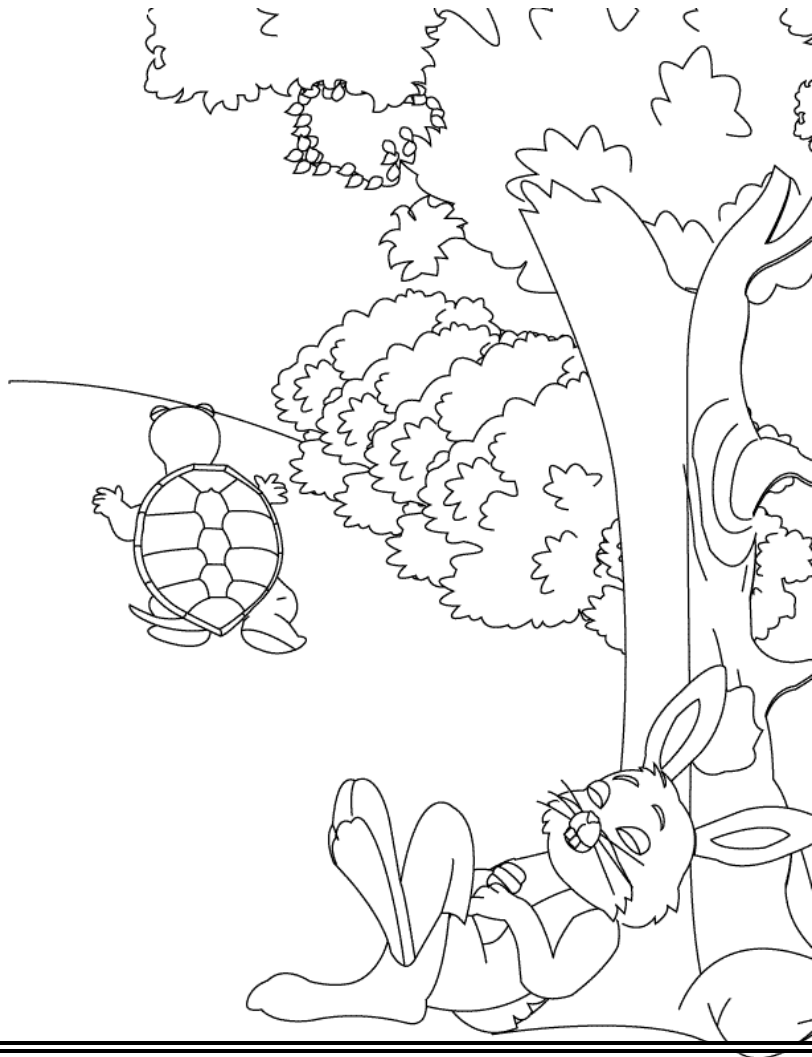
The tortoise and the hare.


After a while the hare eventually woke up, looked around and said, "Just as I thought, no sign of the tortoise. I'm going to win
